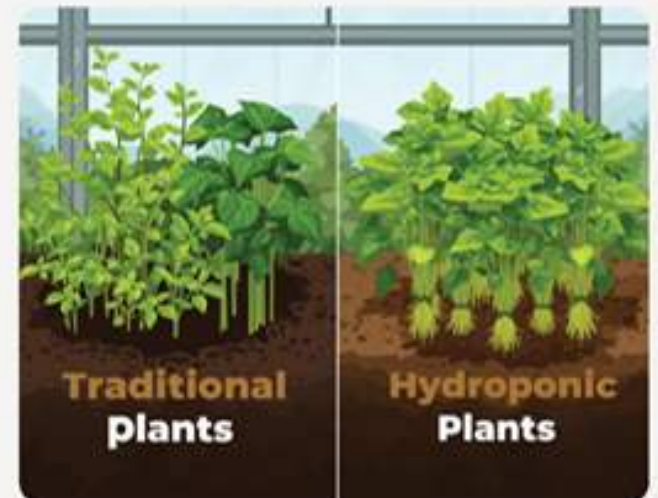
Overview of Hydroponic Systems

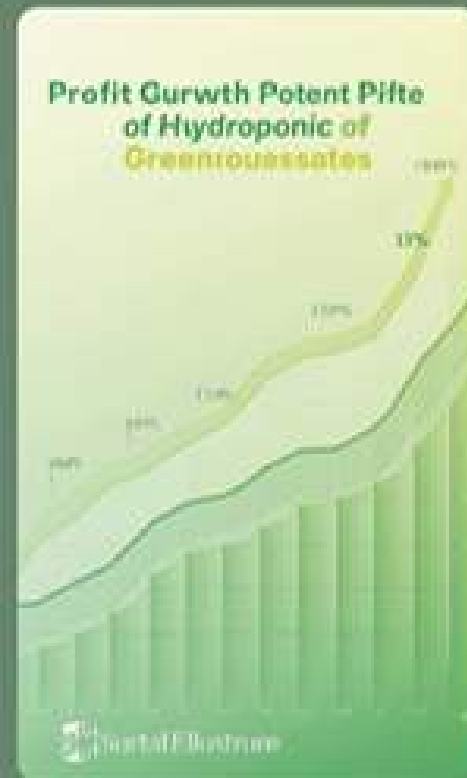
